Dear Minister,

The geosciences are needed to discover, develop and manage these resources. Our future prosperity will depend on these industries remaining healthy, innovative and internationally competitive. Australia faces huge challenges in respect of sustainability of our life style, our environment and our capacity to contribute internationally. Issues of land degradation, water resources, energy supplies, climate change, urbanisation and natural hazards affect not just Australia but the whole Earth. All these matters require input from the geosciences
