Last presentation: 30th June 2009

Peter Buckley (Managing Director of Eastern Iron Limited) gave the last HEDG presentation on *The Maghemite "Mammoth" uncovered in NSW... Coming to terms with a different kind of Iron Ore.* Eastern Iron has been looking at potential iron resources associated with maghemite in lateritic material and palaeochannel systems in central and western New South Wales. Through an extensive drill program, a regionally extensive pisolitic iron has been discovered, which represents an uncemented form of Channel Iron Deposit (CID), a new iron deposit style, or 'NSW-CID'. NSW-CID occurs as a shallow free-digging gravel without goethite cement and therefore does not require drill, blast and stripping operations as it does in

the Pilbara. Peter's talk encouraged much discussion of tonnage, recovery, grades, potential markets, mining methods, pisolite formation and composition amongst the 35-strong audience.
