

KIM STANTON-COOK

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Kim Stanton-Cook was, from 2006 to 2014, Managing Director of ASX-listed Golden Cross Resources, a multi-commodity explorer with projects in the Lachlan Fold Belt, at Broken Hill, in the Gawler Craton, the Yilgarn Craton, the Mount Isa Block and in Panama and Canada.

Kim is an exploration / development geologist with over 40 years' experience gained since graduation from Macquarie University in 1971. He has conducted mineral exploration throughout Australia, in Papua New Guinea, New Zealand, Fiji, the USA and Canada. He has reviewed mineral properties in Vietnam, the Philippines, China, Mongolia and Zimbabwe. His work history spans gold, base metals, nickel, uranium, tin, and platinum group metals exploration, and, to a lesser extent, assisting in the development or production of gold, base metals and uranium in a wide variety of geological environments.

Mine development oversight or direct experience was acquired during employment with:

- Getty Oil Minerals Division 1973 & 1975-1985 (the Jabiluka U-Au, Escondida Cu-Au, and Maureen U-CaF₂-Mo deposits)
- as a contractor to Amoco-Cyprus 1985-1987 (the Selwyn-Starra Cu-Au deposits)
- as Chief Geologist, then Exploration Manager for Delta Gold 1990 -1995 (the Kanowna Belle, Granny Smith-Sunrise Au deposits, Hartley PGM's)
- as Group Exploration Manager for Otter Gold 1995-1997, (Tanami Mines, Martha Hill-Waihi, Beaconsfield-Tasmania Reef Au deposits) and
- Golden Cross resources (Copper Hill and Cargo resource definition and mine studies 2007 – 2014).

Kim is a member of the Professional Societies AIG, SEG, GSA, ASEG and was a long-standing committee member of SMEDG where his involvement now is maintaining the SMEDG web site.
