You may care to study Pennsylvania, where oil was first discovered in the USA in 1859. Tens of thousands of wells drilled, multiple aquifers penetrated, fracking to boost production from 'spent' wells...... Pennsylvania's agricultural output is set out below:

Agriculture is a major industry in the <u>U.S. commonwealth</u> of <u>Pennsylvania</u>. As of the most recent <u>United States Census of Agriculture</u> conducted in 2007, there were 63,163 <u>farms</u> in Pennsylvania, covering an area of 7,809,244 acres (31,602.89 km²) with an average size of 124 acres (0.50 km²) per farm. Pennsylvania ranks fourth in the United States in <u>dairy</u> production, fourth in <u>horticulture</u> retail sales, first in <u>Agaricus mushroom</u> production (62% of U.S. output during 2011–12), fourth in <u>apple</u> production, fourth in grape production, and seventh in <u>winemaking</u>.
