

Unlocking the potential of the Spur Gold–Copper Project, Cargo District, NSW.



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Abstract

The Spur Gold–Copper Project is located within the Cargo District of the central Lachlan Fold Belt in New South Wales, part of the highly prospective Macquarie Arc, known for its world-class porphyry and epithermal copper–gold systems.

Exploration to date has identified a large mineralised system featuring copper, gold and molybdenum geochemical anomalies, potassic to phyllic alteration, and structural and lithological characteristics consistent with fertile magmatic–hydrothermal environments. Ongoing geological interpretation, geochemistry and geophysics continue to refine targets across the district.

The project represents a significant opportunity to advance an emerging Cu–Au system within one of Australia’s most productive metallogenic provinces, unlocking the next phase of discovery potential in the Cargo region.
